


RAIN OR SHINE

Tips for Successful Composting

Act 148, the Universal Recycling Law, made recycling mandatory statewide. It also bans food scraps from the landfill in 2020. Individuals and families have a few different options for dealing with this. Drop-off sites will have food scrap disposal by July 2017. Trash haulers must offer curbside food scrap pick-up. Residents can also choose to compost at home.

Composting is an inexpensive and easy option that almost anyone can do. Here are a few tips:

- 1. Know your solid waste district. Solid waste districts provide solid waste planning for their member towns, as well as low-cost disposal services for televisions, appliances, tires, etc. Further, a solid waste district offers inexpensive composters and free compost classes. The Northwest Vermont Solid Waste Management District serves most towns in Grand Isle and Franklin Counties. Visit nwswd.org or call 524-5986 for more details.
 - 2. Take a free class or read about composting online.
- 3. Think about your food scrap collection system. A good collection system starts with a kitchen container to collect food waste in. This can be emptied daily into a compost bin or pile, but many people prefer to have a five gallon bucket with a lid on the back porch or in the garage to accumulate scraps gathered in the countertop container. The bucket is then emptied into the compost bin every few days.
- 4. Know how to avoid fruit flies. A food scrap container left on the countertop will likely attract fruit flies in the summertime. This can be avoided by emptying the container daily and
- 5. Think about compost bin placement. A bin should be placed far enough from houses so that if it smells (only improperly managed piles smell), it won't be noticeable inside. It should also be accessible in winter.
- 6. Save leaves. Many people just throw food scraps into a compost bin and then wonder why it stinks. It's because "brown" material is needed, too. This is the number one mistake that beginning composters make. Food scraps are going to decompose no matter what, but adding old leaves, twigs, straw, sawdust, used potting soil, and shredded pieces of newspaper, cardboard, and paper towel or toilet paper rolls is necessary to make the right mix and prevent odor. Mix 2-3 units of "browns" for every one unit of food scraps.
- 7. Mix your pile once a week with a shovel or pitchfork. This will get air into the pile and speed decomposition. But decomposition is a natural process and will just happen at a slower rate without your help.
- 8. Plan for winter. Decomposition slows down when it gets cold. Your bin may fill up if you don't have enough capacity. Empty it in the fall and make sure the freshest food scraps are at the bottom of the dumped pile. Or have a second bin or contact your solid waste district about food scrap drop-off points.

Did you know that composting five gallons of food scraps prevents greenhouse gasses equivalent to those made by using a gallon of gasoline? Further, food scraps are the heaviest part of residential waste and generally make up about a third of household garbage. Residents that pay for trash disposal by the bag will save money by composting. Composting keeps material out of the landfill and is great for gardens, too. And it's easy. Reach out to your solid waste district if you need help.




